

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LETTER FROM THE FOUNDER

"WE NAVIGATED THROUGH THE CHALLENGES AND CELEBRATED SUCCESSES AS A FAMILY"

In 2019, we focused on our core values as the guiding principles to lead our internal organization to better serve our mission. We implemented the Entrepreneurship Organizational System into our business and in doing so, we have accomplished more in a single year than ever before. Highlights include promoting Kristina Gutierrez to Marketing and Communications Director which allowed for the launch of our new website, creation of consistent marketing materials, and our first holiday direct mail campaign. Together, Taylor Sass and Kristina also submitted our very first \$1 million dollar grant proposal. In addition, we challenged ourselves to solve special event capacity issues by utilizing more volunteers and hiring a very knowledgeable team member from the nonprofit sector, Sarah Mouton.

We formalized our Finance Committee and finance reporting structure while recruiting volunteer, Jessica Morrison, VP of Commercial Banking at Commerce Bank, who taught us how to earn more through specialized accounts. We became more knowledgeable about the structure of our 990 through the hard work of Joe Reuss, our Board Treasurer and our COO, Jessy Deardurff, identified our new banking partner, Cadence Bank, who has already proved their dedication to our mission by offering low fees and excellent customer service.

In the 3rd and 4th quarters, we completed our 2020 administrative budget, updated our three-year strategic plan, and nominated four new Board Members through the leadership of our Board President, Brad Howell.

We all know running a business is not always the perfection that's perceived through social media. However, we navigated through the challenges and celebrated successes as a family, leaving some actions items for 2020 such as implementing a formal volunteer program and integrating our CRM software. We reinforced accountability among our staff and learned how to build trust internally. We also hired an accounting firm temporarily before realizing we would be more efficient to hire an internal full-time accounting team member, Leigh Ann Love. Welcome to the hen house!

Lastly, and most importantly to us, more than 3,000 parents in the U.S. alone planned funerals for their children who did not win the fight against cancer, including our beloved Gia Gardella. Andrea and Craig Gardella lost their beautiful, intelligent, driven and very charismatic daughter, and her siblings lost their loving sister. Gia aspired to return to Texas Children's Cancer Center someday to fulfill her dream of becoming a nurse.

It is our foremost intention and organizational vision to end Pediatric Cancer. In 2019, we pledged two major commitments totaling \$40 million to fund vital research and amenities for St. Jude Children's Research Hospital and Texas Children's Cancer Center.

I want to personally thank every single volunteer, staff member and mentor, as well as our partners, for another record year. I leave you all with these three simple words in honor of Gia:

Get Into Action.

OUR STORY

SHE DIDN'T KNOW IT THEN, BUT THAT VISIT WOULD CHANGE HER LIFE FOREVER.



After an impressionable 16-year-old pageant winner from Louisiana visited St. Jude Children's Research Hospital in Memphis, she decided it wasn't fair that children had cancer. During her trip she shared a bowl of gumbo with Dalton, a boy undergoing chemotherapy treatments who hadn't eaten in days. She didn't know it then, but that visit would change her life forever.

A few years later, at only 21 years old, Brittany Hebert founded Sky High after being challenged to raise \$10,000 for the very hospital that made such an impact on her. She and a handful of girlfriends, working alongside her at Edie's Biscuits, hosted Sky High's first event: a sporting clay tournament. These women went on to raise \$50,000 and the rest, as they say, is history.

Sky High now hosts banquets, golf tournaments, a brunch, sporting clay tournaments and more events across the country. The organization is comprised of a small dynamic staff, a board of directors and an army of volunteers.

Since 2007, Sky High has supported leading hospitals and research centers to help close the gap in Childhood Cancer rates. To date, the organization has donated over \$14 million to benefit Pediatric Cancer patients and research. What began as a small sporting clay tournament has grown into a multi-million dollar charity that is truly making a difference and saving lives.

OUR INVESTMENTS

TEXAS CHILDREN'S CANCER & HEMATOLOGY CENTER

Sky High for Kids Tumor Biology Center

At this lab, investigators can enable customized, precision therapy designed specifically for each child.

ST. JUDE CHILDREN'S RESEARCH HOSPITAL

The Eric Trump Foundation Surgery & ICU Center

Sky High funded three rooms within the ETF Surgery & ICU Center. Each day eight families spend the most critical time of their lives at this facility.

RONALD MCDONALD HOUSE CHARITIES, MEMPHIS

Sky High is investing in a variety of infrastructure and patient support projects. In 2019 our team completed a \$1.25 million pledge to fund the Power Grid Project to offer a solution to outages at the House. At any given time, we are assisting 53 families staying at the Ronald McDonald House Charities, Memphis.

OUR ONGOING IMPACT

ST. JUDE CHILDREN'S RESEARCH HOSPITAL

Sky High will fund a research floor in the new 625,000-square-foot Advanced Research Center (ARC) at St. Jude Children's Research Hospital. The ARC will be home to several shared resources, including a state-of-the-art biorepository, advanced microscopy, image analysis core and a gene-editing center. It will also house laboratories focused on immunology, neurobiology, cell and molecular biology, metabolomics, epigenetics, genomics, immunotherapy and RNA biology. Research conducted throughout the ARC will help move pediatric cancer survival rates forward.

TEXAS CHILDREN'S CANCER CENTER IMMUNOTHERAPY CENTER

In the U.S., 15,000+ children develop cancer each year. Immunotherapy presents an effective and less toxic treatment for cancer. Sky High will help fund pre-clinical lab research, conduct clinical trials, purchase needed equipment and hire specialized laboratory and clinical research scholars. This investment will expedite the development of new immune therapies for childhood cancer.

TEXAS CHILDREN'S HOSPITAL GLOBAL HOPE

Over 100,000 children develop cancer in sub-Saharan Africa each year and 90% do not survive. Our commitment will be designated to funding Sky High for Kids Training Centers. These advanced training and treatment facilities will be used daily by hundreds of medical professionals and help treat thousands of children suffering from cancer.

RONALD MCDONALD HOUSE CHARITIES, MEMPHIS RISE & SHINE BREAKFAST

Rise and Shine Breakfast offers a hot meal for families as they head out to St. Jude Children's Research Hospital for daily treatments. Chef prepared meals are made possible for the very first time by Sky High.

B.I.G. LOVE CANCER CARE INPATIENT FLOOR WISHLIST

Sky High is partnering with the largest service based nonprofit in Texas, B.I.G. Love Cancer Care. Together, we will provide wish list items 52 weeks a year to inpatient pediatric cancer families on the 7th floor of Texas Children's Hospital. Items range from pajamas to a toothbrush.

PONYTAIL DONATIONS

30 HAIR Our Ponytail Donation Program allows men and women of all ages to cut and donate their hair at a Sky High event. Many of the hair donors fundraise leading to the event, plus each helps us raise thousands during our live action auctions! All donated hair is sent to Children with Hair Loss, a nonprofit that makes hair for children in need.

In 2019, we had 30 selfless donors cut their hair at our internal Sky High events across Texas and Louisiana. Together they helped raised \$13,390.55 for our mission!

TIE FOR SKY HIGH



Each year, Sky High takes hundreds of blankets, created by volunteers, to children fighting cancer. The blankets help provide comfort to children while they undergo treatment.

In 2019, we donated over 600 blankets to children at Texas Children's Cancer and Hematology Center and at St. Jude Children's Research Hospital.

My name is Sadie Keller, and I'm 12 years old. On February 25th, 2015 I heard a word that changed my life forever. I was a soccer player, I loved hanging out with my friends, and going to school. In winter of 2014, when I was 7, I started getting sick.

I got the Flu, then strep throat shortly after, and felt so tired all the time. At one of my soccer games I couldn't catch my breath. I had asthma when I was little, so we thought it may be returning. When I was back at school one day I noticed these little red dots on my legs. They were all over my thighs, stomach, and wrists. We now know that they were petechiae from low platelets. I got more and more pale, and my symptoms got more and more strange, so my mom called my pediatrician to see what it could be. I had seen her several times through all of these things happening so she was aware of everything that had already happened. My pediatrician called in for me to get blood drawn to try and figure out what could be causing all of this.

The following Monday, my mom picked me up from school early that morning. I was so confused why we were going back to the doctor, we had just been there. Once we arrived, they took us right back to a room. I was sitting on my moms lap when my pediatrician said "Sadie's lab results came back and they show that she has Acute Leukemia, it's cancer". I couldn't believe what I heard. My parents started to cry. I whispered in my moms ear "Mom, am I going to die?" I thought, because that's what I thought, you get cancer and you die. She said "No baby, you're going to be okay". We were immediately sent to Children's Medical Center in Dallas and I started chemo that very night, had surgery the next morning to place my port and my journey began.

For over 2 ½ years I received thousands of doses of chemo, had 19 spinal taps, more pokes than I can count, lost my hair 8 times, had 6 surgeries, and went through some of the scariest and rarest side effects . As hard as all of this was, I was determined to stay positive. I didn't want to be mad that I got cancer, so I chose to be grateful for every single day. I would make my nurses and doctors treats and surprises

and take them to the Hospital every week when I went to get chemo. It was so fun for me to make and it took my mind off everything I was going through. I actually would get excited to go to the hospital for chemo each week so that I could pass out all the goodies I had made for them.

I was in the hospital the entire first month of being diagnosed. Eight days after having my port placed, I got a fever and found out that I was septic with an e'coli bacteria. So now, not only did I have cancer in my blood, but I also had a bacteria infection from having no immunity to fight germs. I was sick and it was a really scary time. I was very new to this cancer world. I had only just been diagnosed eight days before. I was literally plucked out of my very normal life and placed on an oncology floor in the hospital for a month. During this month I realized I wasn't alone. Throughout the month, as I would go for a walk down the hallways to stretch my legs. I would see so many children. They also didn't have hair. This is when I realized this was happening to many, many children! Not just me.

When I was well enough to go home, I was so happy! It is so hard to be in the hospital for long periods of time. One day I decided to make a video about what it's like to have cancer as a child. I wanted to let other kids going through cancer to know what to expect and that it will be okay. I made this video 3 months after I was diagnosed, and it now has been seen thousands of times.

Over the last 5 years I have become an advocate for childhood cancer to raise awareness and let people

know that kids get cancer too. I began to Lobby on Capitol Hill in Washington D.C. with the Kids V Cancer organization, to help get Bills passed that will increase funding and help more kids with cancer. Did you know that out of the billions of dollars that go to cancer research, that childhood cancer only receives 4%! This is just another reason why Sky High For Kids is so important! With your help, they are able to fill the gap in much needed research dollars so that all kids can be cured.

When I learned about the 4%, I knew I had to do something. This is why I chose to take my fight to Washington and meet with members of Congress to share my story and educate them on the realities of childhood cancer from a child. I am so happy that I have helped lobby and pass the RACE for Children Act, Creating HOPE Act and the STAR Act, in which I had the incredible opportunity to be by the President's side in the Oval Office as it was signed into law. I work closely with Congressman Michael McCaul who is the co-founder and chair of the Childhood Cancer Caucus. This is also why (with my family's help) I created the Sadie Keller Foundation. I know how hard it is to go through cancer, so I wanted to put smiles on the faces of childhood cancer fighters everywhere by giving them special gifts and remind them to keep fighting. So far we have been able to reach more than 60,000 childhood cancer fighters, across the country and in 11 Children's hospitals by providing toys and gifts and we provide financial support to parents in the hospital for long periods of time with their child in DFW.

My goal is to raise awareness about childhood cancer and get more research so no kid has to go through what I went through and so that every child can survive. We are the future after all, and without us, there is no future. I am SO grateful to Miss Brittany, Miss Kristina, Miss Jessy and everyone at Sky High For Kids for all that they do to help kids with cancer! They are making a HUGE impact and I am so happy to share my story!

Total Safety


